It might be a possession; it might be an activity that consumes a lot of your time. Give it up and replace it with giving time or money to a cause which fights injustice and helps those in need. Connecting the Gospel...

...to the First Reading: Both Isaiah and Peter declare themselves to be sinful people. But the call of God comes to sinful people and in diverse places (Temple, boats).

The call depends not on the individual or the place, but on the graciousness of God.



...to experience: Too often we feel the burden of discipleship rests solely on

our own shoulders. The gospel depicts Jesus initiating the call—he comes to Peter at his boat; he invites Peter to follow. Our discipleship rests upon Jesus long before we begin to follow. <u>https://liturgy.slu.edu</u>

Question: Where did three children witness six apparitions of Mary, Mother of God in 1917?



Did you know some saints had a miraculous sweet scent.

The "odor of sanctity" isn't just a metaphor!

There's a sweet miracle that you should know about...

Did you know some saints had a miraculously sweetsmelling fragrance?

Yes! It's sometimes called the "odor of sanctity" that emanates from them, often even after death. It's almost as if their holiness and friendship with God radiates from them through a sweet fragrance.

Let's meet some of these sweet-smelling saints...



St. Therese of Lisieux: After her death in 1897, many reported that her grave and relics emitted a beautiful floral scent, even before her body was exhumed during her beatification process. This fragrance was experienced by those who prayed for her intercession and has been noted in connection with her relics to this day.

St. Padre Pio: Witnesses reported that he exuded a perfume-like smell, often described as a blend of flowers and incense. This occurred even during his lifetime and was experienced by people in his presence or praying to him from afar.

St. Rita of Cascia: Her incorrupt body, preserved in a glass coffin in Italy, is said to emit a subtle, sweet aroma. Visitors to her shrine often comment on this unexpected fragrance, which has persisted for centuries.

The Church views the odor of sanctity as a sign, not proof, of sainthood. It's never the sole reason for canonization. For those saints whose lives bore the fragrance of virtue, it seems fitting that their earthly remains would bear the fragrance of heaven.

Although we may not possess this miraculous fragrance, we can use a sweet scent to help cultivate a holy and prayerful space with a Catholic candle! https://catholiccompany.com/getfed/who-was-the-real-st-valentine/

(Practicing) Catholic – Recognize God in your Ordinary Moment) The Catch



I love today's Gospel passage, and not just because I love a good fish fry.

I love it because I am Peter. Over and over again, I am Peter, standing here exhausted because I relied on my own abilities, and it got me nowhere. I'm ready to call it quits. I'm ready to say it's too hard. And here comes Jesus, asking me to lower my net. To keep trying.

And I try to talk sense into him. "It's not going to work, God," I insist. "I've been trying."

"You've been trying," Jesus agrees. "But you haven't asked. for my help yet."

What does it mean to lower your net? It sounds so simple and so easy, but it takes a great deal of humility and trust. I think I'm the expert on my own life, the captain of my own ship. Peter probably thought so, too — he was the fisherman, after all. Why would a fisherman listen to a carpenter on matters of fishing?

Lowering your net means giving God control and letting yourself be changed by what He chooses to show you.

It means to listen to God's instructions, even when you don't understand them, even when you find them frustrating. It means to keep trying the hard thing that you know is the right thing, even when it hasn't born much fruit. It means to keep loving the person who is making life hard on you, even when all you want to do is give into feelings of bitterness and distrust.

If we would only lower our nets, the catch would astound us.
