The following measures are based on guidelines issued by the State of Alaska, CDC, USCCB, Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions, The Catholic Medical Association and the Thomistic Institute. These are recommended *temporary measures, and subject to change*, that the diocese is taking to reduce the possible spread of COVID-19.

TEMPORARY Protocols for Attending Mass:

- Stay six feet apart from non-household members;
- Wash hands frequently;
- Sanitize and clean high touch surfaces frequently;
- Stay home if you are sick, and get tested for COVID-19 if you have symptoms;
- Wear a face covering in public places when near others; and

• Be mindful and respectful to those Alaskans that are most vulnerable to this virus, including Alaska's senior population and those with existing health conditions

Reception of Holy Communion:

Individual have the right to choose to receive Holy Communion in the hand or on the tongue. Based on solid science and medicine it is strongly recommended that Holy Communion be received on the hand. Those who wish to receive on the tongue will be permitted to do so. *However, if you choose to receive on the tongue you are accepting the increased risk of potential exposure to COVID-19. Ministers of Holy Communion will not purify their hands between communicants.* In order to maintain order during the distribution of Holy Communion, you are asked to follow the direction of the priest celebrant at Mass as to how Communion will take place.

WEEKDAY SCHEDULE

Daily Mass Monday to Friday

- 7:30am Mass held at SHC
- *12:10pm Mass held at ICC (M, T, Th, F)
- 5:30pm Mass held at ICC (W) followed by Adoration with Confession.

Liturgical Changes

Dispensation from the Sunday obligation remains in force.

Ministries are still limited at the present time. 1 Musician and 1 Cantor is the norm *unless there are multiple choir members in a single household.*

Seminarians will serve as lectors. Priest, deacon and seminarians will be the regular ministers of Holy Communion

As we return to our worship, we will

- Refrain from handshakes and embraces at the beginning of Mass
- Refrain from holding of hands through the Our Father
- > We will also refrain from the Sign of Peace,
- > Cease the distributing the Precious Blood.

Holy Communion

As for Receiving Holy Communion the safest way to receive Communion is in the hand. Those who opt for Communion on the tongue should wait until after Mass to receive and the priest will distribute to those wanting to receive on the tongue.

Offertory:

Baskets will not be passed around for a collection. The faithful may drop their offering off in a stationary basket at the end of Mass. We will not have gift-bearers



Fr. Robert Fath's Corner

This past week it was announced that Bishop Andrew Bellisario of the Diocese of Juneau was named the first bishop of the newly formed Archdiocese of Anchorage-Juneau. His appointment has raised several questions. What's the difference between a bishop and an archbishop? What's the difference between a diocese and an archdiocese? How was this new archdiocese formed?

The first two questions are fairly easy to answer. In terms of ordination and responsibility bishops and archbishops are essentially the same. They are clerics who have been appointed by the Pope (the Bishop of Rome) to oversee the pastoral care of the faithful within a defined geographical area. These geographical areas are called dioceses and archdioceses and are akin to states within a country. The difference between an archbishop and a bishop is that archbishops have additional responsibilities as the "head" bishop in particular regions called provinces. Typically, an archdiocese/archbishop correspond to a major population center in a region. In certain matters, an archbishop is responsible for speaking for a province after consultation with the other bishops of the region (called suffragans) on matters that commonly affect them all. Archbishops will often be asked who they think would make a good candidate to become a bishop within their province to assist the Holy Father in his choice. They may even be asked to step in to investigate certain concerns that the Holy See may have in a diocese in his particular province.

In addition to Bishop Bellisario being named an archbishop, he was named as the first archbishop of a new archdiocese. Under normal circumstances new dioceses and archdioceses are formed by taking a part of an existing diocese and separating it into a new diocese. In some cases, though, the Holy See realizes that because of population, number of priests, even the international border changes, that two dioceses should be combined for the good of the people. That was the case with the Archdiocese of Anchorage and the Diocese of Juneau. While geographically large, the Catholic population of both dioceses is relatively small. The Holy See felt that the people of Anchorage and Juneau would be better served by combining their respective resources and reducing administration. But the Church likes to honor and remember older preexisting dioceses, hence the reason that the newly formed archdiocese retains the names of both Anchorage and Juneau.

To the Diocese of Fairbanks,

Some of you already know this, but I wanted to make it official at this time that, after having completed my two-year degree in philosophy at Mt. Angel Seminary on 8 May 2020, I have decided to take a break from my vocational journey toward priesthood in order to pursue other paths that God may be leading me. It has not been an easy journey nor an easy decision (nor should it be!), but I believe this is where God is calling me right now. Please know that I have appreciated each and every one of your prayers and forms of support during these past three years, both at the seminary and while living at the Frassati House of Discernment. It has been an honor to represent the Diocese of Fairbanks during this time, and I still plan on returning to Fairbanks as soon as feasible (given the COVID-19 situation), so I hope to see many of you once I get back. Please continue to pray for vocations for the diocese and encouraging the men in your lives to give seminary a try. They won't regret it; I know it has definitely been fruitful for me personally!

May you all be happy, healthy, and safe during these uncertain times!
