Focusing the Gospel

Key words and phrases: Who do people say, Some say, who do you say, You are the Christ, I will build my church

To the point: In answer to Jesus' query about his identity, the disciples tell Jesus what others are saying about him. Jesus is not simply initiating an open discussion, however; he is leading the disciples to personal understanding and profession of who he is. Peter arrives there when he acclaims, "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God." Each of us must come to this same personal profession about who Jesus is. The church is that community of individuals who have come personally to know who Jesus is and have chosen personally to make Jesus known to the world. Jesus himself will lead us there through our personal encounters with him.

To Stay Catholic in College: Learn the arguments for God's existence. Philosophy professor Ed Feser came to believe in God through the philosophical arguments he was teaching his students. The fact is that we can know that God exists; that point is not a mere matter of faith. Learning the arguments also will help you get a grasp of the God Catholic theology describes. I recommend Fradd and Delfino's book *Does God Exist* (which is also a useful primer on philosophy) and Kreeft and Tacelli's *Handbook of Christian Apologetics* (a volume that belongs in every Christian home).

Gestures at Mass

After reading what happens at Mass, we follow up with a reminder on the gestures we make during Mass.

Triple Sign of The Cross: This is done before the Gospel is traced with thumb on forehead, lips and heart. Typically, people pray inaudibly that their minds and hearts be open to hear the Gospel and their lips open to proclaim it.

First, you trace a cross on your forehead,

representing that as a Catholic I must understand the Gospel. And you begin quietly, to yourself, to pray saying, "May the Word of God be ever on my mind...."

Then, you trace a cross over your mouth, touch your nose, your chin, the left corner of your mouth, then the right corner of your mouth which represents that we must proclaim it - and say, "On my lips...."

Then, you trace a cross over your heart, still with your right thumb, cross your heart, and say, "and in my heart". Meaning that as a Catholic we will take the Gospel to heart.
