5 Books Every Catholic Student in College Needs on Their Bookshelf


Lists can be made, and they will vary depending on who you ask, but the following are books that would help you defend your faith when you first leave home and enter college or the work force with non-Catholics. Here are 5 books that need to be on your bookshelf. These would be the *first* five books you own.



- 1. The Holy Bible, Revised Standard Version, Catholic Edition. The Bible was compiled in the 4th century. There are 73 books in the Bible. We did not add books, the Protestant Reformers subtracted them.
- 2. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC). One of the greatest works of Catholic theology, it is divided into four parts: The Profession of Faith, The Celebration of the Christian Mystery, Life in Christ, and Christian Prayer. Developed by Blessed John Paul II and a Commission of Cardinals and Bishops in 1986, promulgated on October 11, 1992. The CCC is the menu guide to the Catholic faith.
- 3. Butler's Lives of the Saints/Introduction to Mary. They are essentially two books. Saints read the Lives of Saints as an example on how to live a holy life. Introduction to Mary was written to be a high school textbook, so it's relatively easy to comprehend and helps one to understand the love of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
- 4. Praying in the Presence of Our Lord. Fr. Benedict Groeschel, C.F.R. offer encouragement in prayers and writing to participate in Eucharistic Adoration.
- 5. Man's Search For Meaning. While not specifically Catholic, Viktor Frankl helps one grow as a human being.
