Everyone Has a Divine Vocation



St. Mark's feast day is celebrated on April 25th in the Catholic Church. His legacy as a Gospel writer and missionary continues to inspire and guide Christians around the world today.

St. Mark the Evangelist is one of the four evangelists who wrote a gospel account of the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. He is

widely believed to be the author of the Gospel of Mark, which is one of the four canonical gospels in the New Testament.

According to tradition, St. Mark was born in Cyrene, in present-day Libya, and he was a follower of St. Peter, the first Pope. St. Mark traveled with St. Peter to Rome and helped him in his missionary work. It is believed that he wrote his Gospel account while he was in Rome, around 60-70 AD.

The Gospel of Mark is the shortest of the four Gospels and is known for its fast-paced narrative style. It focuses mainly on the actions and miracles of Jesus Christ, rather than his teachings, and emphasizes the importance of faith and trust in God. St. Mark's Gospel is also known for its vivid descriptions of the events surrounding Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection.

As we reflect on St. Mark's life and teachings, we are reminded of the importance of sharing the message of Jesus Christ with others. St. Mark's commitment to spreading the Gospel to those around him, even in the face of adversity, serves as an inspiration for us to follow in his footsteps. May we all be inspired by his example to share the good news of Jesus Christ with those around us and to live our lives in service to God and our fellow human beings.

The lion is the symbol of St. Mark because of the biblical story of Ezekiel, in which the prophet has a vision of four creatures, one of which is a winged lion. This vision has been interpreted to represent the four evangelists, and the lion is the symbol for St. Mark. In addition, there is a tradition



that St. Mark was closely associated with lions. It is said that when he was preaching in Egypt, he was confronted by a fierce lion, but the animal became tame and docile in his presence. This event is often depicted in artwork, with St. Mark standing next to a lion.
