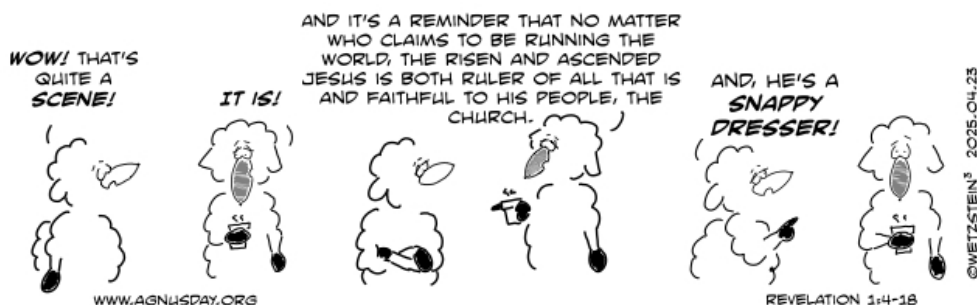

Pope Francis' funeral Mass will take place on Saturday, April 26, 2025, at 10:00 AM in St. Peter's Square – presided over by Cardinal Giovanni Batista Re, Dean of the College of Cardinals, which will be concelebrated by Patriarchs, Cardinals, Archbishops, Bishops, and priests across the globe.

The Eucharistic celebration will conclude with the *Ultima commendatio* and the *Valedictio*, marking the beginning of the Novendiales, or nine das of mourning and Masses for the repose of Pope Francis' soul.

The late Pope's body will then be taken into St. Peter's Basilica and then to the Basilica of St. Mary Major for entombment. <https://www.vatican.va>

The [General Congregation](#) of the College of Cardinals takes place at the Vatican, marking the beginning of a period of prayer, reflection, and preparation that follows the death of Pope Francis.

The election of a new Pope begins between 15 to 20 days after the death. The camerlengo, a cardinal in the Catholic Church, is in charge of organizing the election in a process known as the conclave.

As of 21 April 2025, the College included 135 Cardinal Electors (*Universi Dominici Gregis* established a limit of 120 Cardinal Electors), 108 of whom were appointed by Pope Francis, and 117 non-electors.

Those who have already turned 80 years old on the day the *Sede Vacante* begins are excluded. However, Cardinals over 80 may still participate in preparatory meetings preceding the election.

Pope Paul VI, in the apostolic constitution *Romano Pontifici Eligendo* (October 1, 1975), introduced numerous changes in the laws governing the election of the Roman Pontiff. Thus:

1. Only persons who have been named cardinals of the Church may be electors of the Pope.
2. The number of electors is now limited to 120*, allowing each cardinal to bring two or three assistants to the conclave. (*Pope Francis chose to waive restriction during his pontificate – 135 under 80 are eligible.)
3. While the conclave is not strictly required for validity, it is the normal way a pope is elected, during what may be called a sacred retreat made in silence, seclusion, and prayer.
4. Three forms of election are allowed, i.e., by acclamation of all the electors, by compromise in which certain electors are given authority to act in the name of all, and by voting ballot.
5. If the newly elected person is a bishop, he becomes pope at once, but if he is not yet a bishop, he is to be ordained to the episcopacy immediately.
6. If no one is elected after three days, the conclave is to spend a day in prayer while allowing the electors freedom to converse among themselves.
7. Secrecy is to be strictly observed under penalty of excommunication.
8. If an ecumenical council or synod of bishops is in progress, it is automatically suspended until authorized by the newly elected pontiff to proceed.

We should pray for the repose of the soul of Pope Francis who has been called to his heavenly home, and ask that the Holy Spirit inspire and guide our Cardinal-electors as they choose a new Holy Father worthy to lead us.
